In January, 2010, the doors will open on the organization’s new 12,000 square-foot Remillard Family Resource Center, a contemporary facility that will serve as home for the group’s full range of operations – administration, food preparation, financial support and mentoring – enabling them to address an even broader range of local needs.

“We’re grateful for all the support that Devcon is able to provide,” said Linda Gobe, executive director for Boca Helping Hands. “With our challenging economy, we’ve seen a sharp increase in requests for assistance recently.
